#### E. During the last 12 months, the station employment unit engaged in the following initiatives:

WFDD conducts numerous internship and training sessions to expose participants to careers in radio:

- 1. Radio Camp, (June 22<sup>nd</sup> through July 17<sup>th</sup> 3 weeks) WFDD conducted a day camp for middle school students where WFDD staff train them in the use of broadcast software and equipment, as well as, how to write, voice and create a radio interview for broadcast on WFDD. Students have returned to volunteer and help other students with camp.
- 2. Radio 101 is a semester long class where high school students are taught by WFDD staff how to create, write, voice and edit a radio editorial story that airs on WFDD. Radio 101 runs the entire school year while school is in session. During the summer the instructor assists with Radio Camp.
- 3. The station offers a formal radio internship program with Wake Forest University, and an informal internship program with other area colleges and schools to allow members of the community to work in the radio station to determine their desire to continue in the field. Tracks include News production and reporting, Sales and Marketing.
- 4. WFDD trained a student to work as a facilitator with Radio Camp (for middle school students) in June of 2015 and trained her in radio production and editing.
- 5. Created student ambassador program that meets monthly at WFDD to educate students at Wake Forest University about careers in broadcasting. Students meet at the station for learning opportunities from professional staff and participate in student lead opportunities to engage their peers in listening parties, radio broadcasting Q&As and volunteering at the station.
- 6. Began working with Wake Radio, Wake Forest University's student run internet radio station. WFDD trained students in broadcasting and now airs Wake Radio content on WFDD's HD3 digital channel over the air allowing student the opportunity to work with broadcast professionals and follow FCC regulations while broadcasting to our 32 county listening area.

In addition to the above programs, the WFDD staff conducts tours, attends career fairs and participates in panel discussions throughout the year. WFDD Staff also:

- 1. WFDD Community Open Hose to give tours to show how programming is produced and broadcast. September 17, 2015.
- 2. WFDD presented to the Greensboro Chamber of Commerce event about WFDD radio, working in radio and the types of opportunities at the station from volunteering to employment. October 29, 2015.

- 3. WFDD spoke to student about broadcast careers at Wake Forest University Student Activities Fair to expose students to internship opportunities and involvement with the student ambassador program at WFDD. August 2, 2015.
- 4. Intern from Salem Academy interns with WFDD for the month of January 2015 as part of a high-school internship on exploring a career in broadcasting.
- 5. Diggs-Latham Elementary school tour of WFDD studios. February 16, 2016.
- 6. Cook Elementary school tour of WFDD studios. February 18, 2016.
- 7. WFDD's Tom Dollenmayer presents about journalism jobs/careers to Wake Forest Journalism students at WFDD studios. November 2015.
- 8. WFDD's George Newman judged student radio engineering contest at Career Center.
- 9. WFDD's George Newman presented at career day at Ibraham Elementary Scholl for career day.
