# Forsyth County Government COVID-19 Daily Briefing October 30, 2020

Updated weekdays by approximately 12:30pm

One hundred and two new cases and one death have been reported since yesterday's daily briefing was issued. There have been 9,039 laboratory-confirmed cases in Forsyth County. All daily cases reported by the State are presumed Forsyth County residents but may later transfer to another county if the case is later identified as not residing in Forsyth County. Of the 9,039, 7,787 are presumed recovered. The case count is subject to change throughout the day but will only be reported once per day in the daily briefing.

The Public Health Director will provide a detailed briefing at 2:00pm at the beginning of the November 5th Board of County Commissioners meeting, which will be conducted remotely. #### **Public Health Director Comment**




- Avoid direct contact with trick-or-treaters while staying at least six feet apart.
- Give out treats outdoors, if possible.
- Set up a station with individually bagged treats for kids to take.
- Wash your hands before handling and distributing treats.
- Make a cloth mask part of your costume. A costume mask is not a substitute for a cloth mask. Do not wear a
  costume mask over a cloth mask since it may make breathing more difficult.
- Bring hand sanitizer with you.
- Lastly, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds when you get home and before you eat any treats."


