Forsyth County Government COVID-19 Daily Briefing July 9, 2020

Updated weekdays by 12:30pm

Seventy-five new cases have been reported since yesterday's daily briefing was issued. There have been 3,525 laboratory-confirmed cases in Forsyth County. All cases reported by the Forsyth County Department of Public Health are Forsyth County residents. Of the 3,525, 2,170 have recovered. The case count is subject to change throughout the day but will only be reported once per day in the daily briefing.

The Public Health Director will provide a detailed briefing at 2:00pm at the beginning of the July 23rd Board of County Commissioners meeting, which will be conducted remotely. 
The Public Health Director will provide a detailed briefing and will hold a Question & Answer session with the media at 4:00pm today. A video link and call-in number was sent to the media.



Forsyth County COVID-19 Cases


